



The (Skills) Landscape in Washington

- ✓ Workforce remain bipartisan issue, though differences on paths forward
- ✓ WIOA implementation underway, but potential risks ahead
- ✓ Other skills conversations will impact success of workforce investments

A middle-skill gap


United States jobs and workers by skill level 2015

America's workforce: We can't compete if we cut.



WIOA (Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act)

- ✓ Implementation underway states just submitted two-year plan modifications March 15
- ✓ Performance negotiations will begin soon for most core programs
- ✓ Uncertainty about future Administration has proposed significant cuts, though Congress just (modestly) increased funding for FY18

Work Based Learning

- ✓ Apprenticeship Executive Order in June 2017, calls for expanded approval process
- ✓ Congressional funding for apprenticeship increased from \$95m to \$145 million for FY'18

Postsecondary Education

- ✓ Growing interest in alignment with employer demand, non-traditional students
- ✓ Key issues include expanding financial aid to workforce programs, increased accountability, and student supports
- √ Perkins Act stalled in Senate
- √ Higher Education Act stalled in House



Welfare "Reform"?

- ✓ Strong interest from WH, Congressional leaders in cutting back SNAP, Medicaid, other benefits including through new work requirements
- ✓ Broader "reconciliation" bill unlikely
- √ Farm Bill reauthorization (SNAP) may happen in early 2018
