

- Develop and lead the "Economic Disaster Recovery Project" (EDRP) modelled after IEDC's technical team model
- Provide flood-impacted communities with training, resources and information to accelerate their economic recovery and build local capacity



EDA'S RESPONSE

- 20 Volunteers from Alberta, BC and Ontario and IEDC
- Identify a primary liaison in each community responsible for the economic development portfolio to take the lead on their side






TECHNICAL TEAM ASSESSMENTS


- 11 Community Reports were completed and presented

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2016 FORT MCMURRAY WILDFIRES

2016 WILDFIRES

May 2016 - Fort McMurray wildfire becomes Canada's most costly insured disaster

~80,000+ residents evacuated, 1595 structures destroyed (2579 dwelling units)

Costliest disaster in Canadian history (\$3.58 billion)

Goals:

- Register businesses
- Collect data to support immediate, short and long-term recovery needs
- Provide information and referrals
- Assess eligibility and distribute CRC Small Business Relief Funding to eligible businesses



Results:

- Handled over 15,000 calls, and registered
 4,134 companies
- Completed a needs survey and provided case management
- Gave 3,296 companies each \$1000 emergency grants
- Implemented a social media campaign



- Opened Back to Business Resource Centre (BBRC)
- One stop shop for businesses to get local, municipal, provincial and federal recovery resources
- Included various partners



- BBRC Initiatives:
 - YMM Welcome Walks
 - Ask an Expert Program/Learning Events
 - Back to Business Coaching Program
 - YMM Home Shows/Expos/BSN Events
 - Job Fair
- Canadian Red Cross Phase 2/3 Funding
- RMWB Small Business Workforce Support
 Program

- EDA Technical Assistance Visit/Report:
 - 10 member team- 4 streams
 - 1 week of stakeholder meetings on-site
 - 200+ interviews
 - Developed over 50 immediate, short, medium and long-term business and economic recovery recommendations








- A Business Recovery Park was not needed
