


Arts & Culture Program

What are we learning?

Changes in community

- Creative Placemaking helps create important preconditions necessary for long-term change
- Requires community development field to re-think community change processes, as well as methods used to assess progress

Lasting systems change

- Creative ways of working vs.
 entrenched ways
- Tools, resources, and organizational structures to facilitate new ways of working
- Accountability systems and procedures

Cross-sectoral work

- Happens at slower place
- Requires supportive leadership w/expansive view of arts, culture and design
- Requires appetite for experimentation and risk
