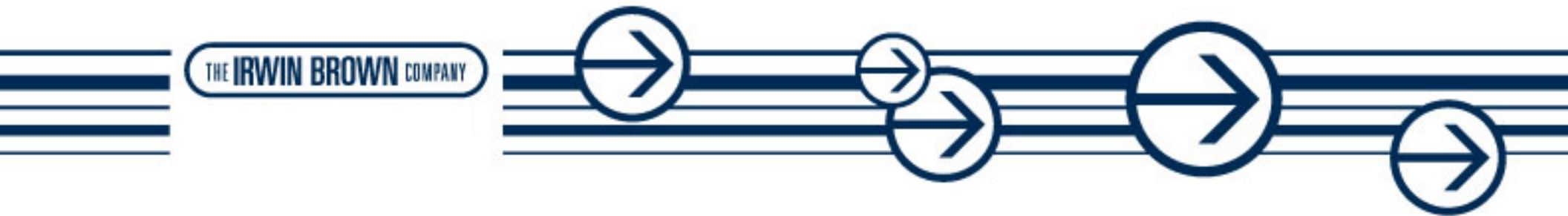

DOMESTIC TRANSPORTATION



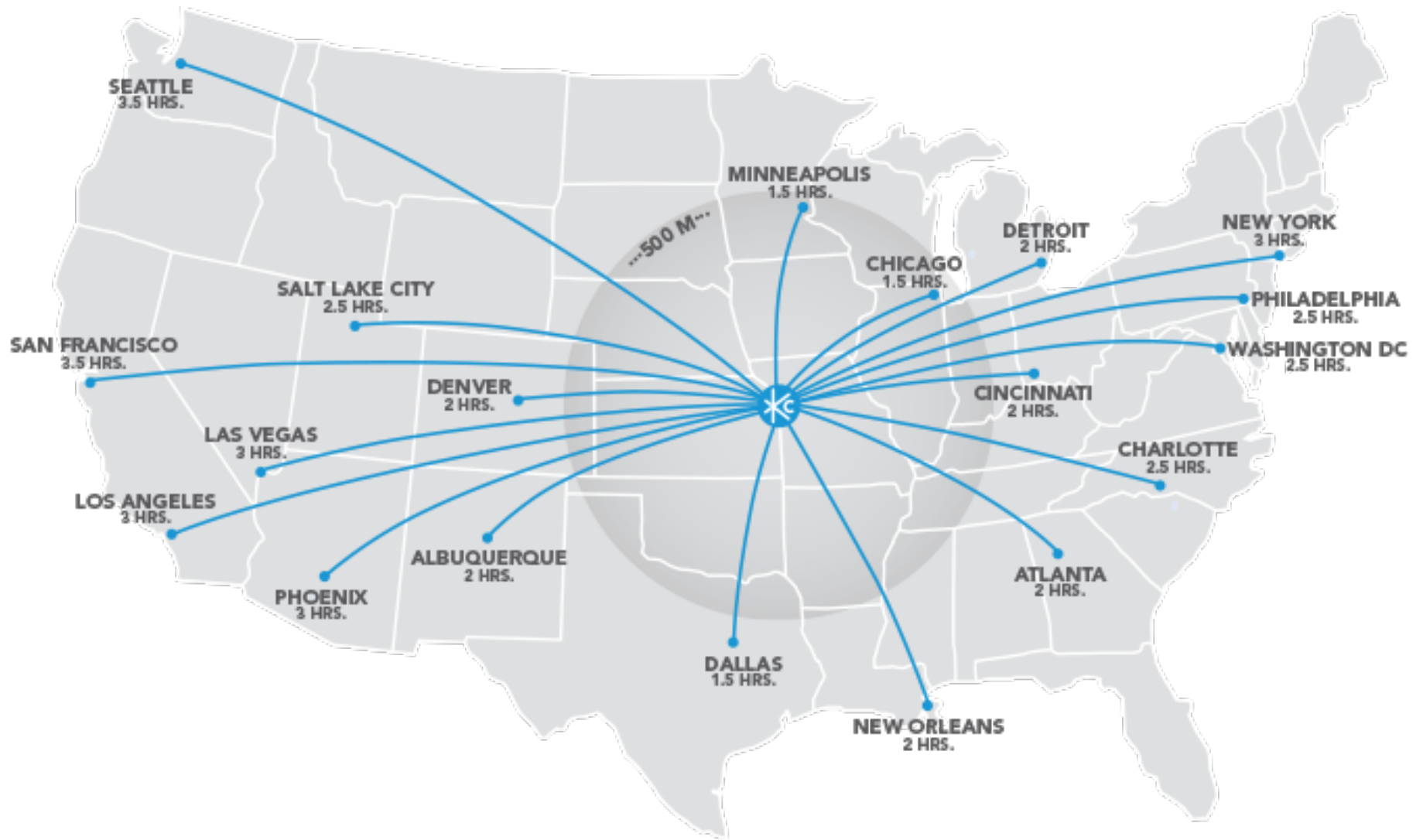
Trucking is the primary way cargo is moved around the country, but there is a trucker shortage and in many places, infrastructure may not support heavy loads.

INTERNATIONAL TRANSPORTATION

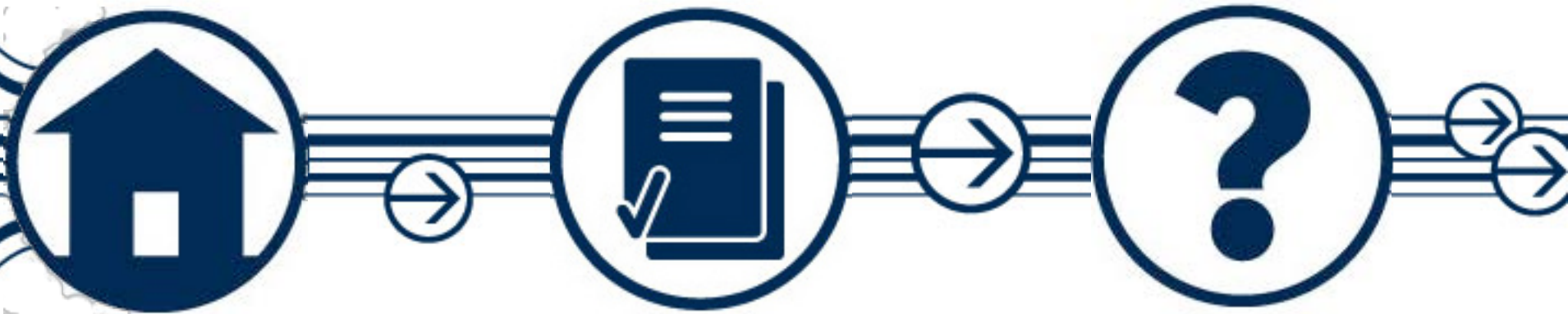


Companies bring in parts and packaging as well as sell to international customers. Having access to ports, rail roads and airports can be a deciding factor for a company's location.

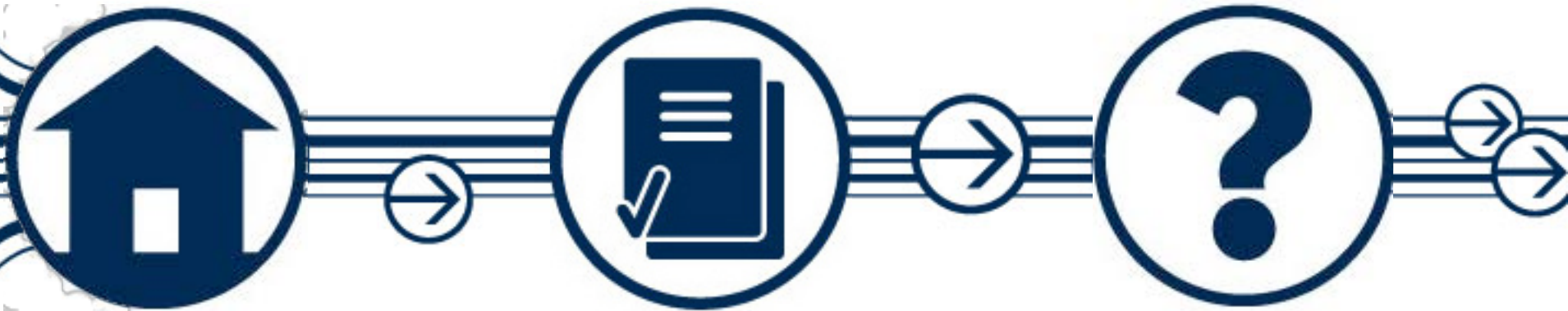


KEY PARTNERS
