




While the United States has experienced a job recovery...



...household incomes have yet to fully recover















Median wages for whites and people of color, 2015













Advanced Industry share of national totals, 2015




Advanced Industry intensity has declined in past decades

Metropolitan areas with at least 10% of employment in Advanced Industries










College degree attainment matters more than ever





Minneapolis-St Paul Regional Dashboard






